Environment

The Perth Convention and Exhibition Centre (PCEC) can be accessed by car, train, bus, ferry, taxi or on foot.

24 hour paid parking is available directly under the Centre, providing direct access entry to PCEC during opening hours.

All public areas are wheelchair accessible. Courtesy wheelchairs are available from the Information Desk on Level 2 (subject to availability).

Universal Access Toilets are situated throughout the Centre.

Bag and lunch storage will be available in a holding area near the entrance of the exhibition. Please note that the area is not secured, and that other schools and the public will have access to this area.

Lunches may be eaten outside in the Level 2 'Summer Garden' in front of the cafe (see attached maps). In inclement weather, and space permitting, an indoor location will be made available through consultation with Exhibition Staff.

Transport

Transport to and from the venue remains the responsibility of the visiting school.

Supervisor/Supervisory Team

It is a requirement to provide a supervisory team for WA Museum excursions. The school supervisory team must accompany students throughout the excursion, actively monitor behaviour and intervene as necessary.

External Provider Information

Clearances:

WA Museum and Exhibition Staff all have a current Working with Children Checks.

It is a pre-employment requirement that staff of the Western Australian Museum provide a National Police Clearance.

Current Accreditations and Qualifications:

WA Museum Staff are experienced and professional practitioners with varying levels of experience and qualifications.

Onsite staffing includes those with current senior first-aid certificates. A First-Aid kit is available both within the exhibition, and within the greater PCEC complex.

Supervision Strategies

The WA Museum requires the following supervision ratios, with a mandatory minimum of 2 supervisors per school supervisory team:

• Years K-2, minimum 1 adult to 6 students

- Years 3-10, minimum 1 adult to 10 students
- Years 11-12 minimum 1 supervisor with the group

It is **compulsory** that students in K-Year 10 are allocated to groups with a supervising adult for the duration of their visit to the Exhibition and PCEC. Entry fees apply to all supervisory staff.

Identification of Excursion Participants

Identification of excursion participants is the responsibility of the individual school. It can be helpful to staff if students are dressed in school uniform, for clear identification, and if the school supervisory team members wear a name badge.

Exhibition Staff and Volunteers wear a uniform and a name badge, and are located at the entry to the exhibition at all times, as well as within the exhibition space.

Communication Strategies

Communication strategies between students and school supervisory team are the responsibility of the school. Please do not use whistles, two-way radios or mega-phones during your visit.

School supervisory teams are encouraged to bring a mobile telephone that they can be contacted on, and can use to call out during their site visit as necessary. Supervising teachers are asked to provide their mobile telephone number when booking their excursion. The PCEC is equipped with a public address system – please approach PCEC Staff if you require assistance.

Exhibition Staff are located throughout exhibition and are in contact with each other and the front entry via two-way radios.

Emergency Response Plan

In the event of an emergency it is essential that all school visitors take directions from Exhibition Staff and PCEC Staff.

It is suggested that school supervisory teams have access to a list of names of participating students, contact telephone numbers, student medical information and relevant health information of supervisors. It is the responsibility of the school to provide basic first aid to the students. PCEC or Exhibition Staff will assist if possible.
