Introduction

On 23rd April I departed from Perth to London to commence a four month visit to Europe. The aim of this was to investigate and record post-medieval artefacts recovered from European 17th and 18th century wrecks. The project was sponsored by an Australian Research Council Grant.

The object of the project "Investigation and Recording of Post-Medieval artefacts recovered from European 17th and 18th century wrecks", was to collect data and information on dated finds contemporary with material recovered from Dutch East Indiaman wrecks lying off the Western Australian coast.

This has been achieved by photographically recording 17th and 18th century artefacts in European museums and collections. With this information the purpose was to:

- Make a photographic register of post-medieval artefacts recovered from 17th and 18th century European wrecks available in Western Australia.
- On the basis of the register and the artefacts recovered from East Indiaman in Western Australian waters, compile a catalogue of 17th and 18th century artefacts.

During the fieldwork I took 2088 black and white and 1296 colour photographs (altogether 3384 pictures) from 31 different post-medieval wrecks, namely:

Zecwijk, Royal George, Hollandia, Princess Maria, Amsterdam, Lastdrager, Mereysteyn, Witte Leeuwe, Kennermerland, de Liefde, Jutholmsvraket, Fula Gubben, Fyrspannaren, Wasa Wanskapen, St Sophia, Constantia, Goteborg, Alsanabbenvraket, Riksapplet, Sancto Christo de Castello, Dartmouth, Association, Girona, Eorstovraket, St Nikolai, Curacao, Lossen, Bamlevraket, Gronskersvraket & Kabelvravet.

On the basis of this material two photographic registers of European post-medieval artefacts have been compiled. One contains 1296 colour slides of dated artefacts from 31 post-medieval wrecks with references to the wrecks and the museums hosting the artefacts. The second register contains 2088 black and white negatives with contact sheets and references for each film.

As a result of this work Western Australia has today the largest known register of dated artefacts available in any museum.

So far no catalogue has been compiled on the basis of the register and the artefacts recovered from the Dutch East Indiamen foundered off the Western Australian coast.

At present it is not possible to terminate this work as I am going to take up a position at the maritime museum in Malmo, Sweden.

However I am most interested in finishing the project and would like to return to Australia for that purpose at earliest convenience, possibly in 1980.

The material collected during the 4 months fieldwork in Europe is invaluable and it would therefore be most unfortunate not to try and compile it into a catalogue of dated 17th and 18th century finds as this would be of benefit to anybody working with post-medieval archaeology. My intention is therefore to, at the earliest possible date, submit a new application for the completion of the work.
