How to get started

- 1 Colour your game to make it look attractive.
- 2 Cut out the tors (dinosaur heads).
- **3** Enjoy playing Colossal Fossil Hunt with your family and friends.

How to play

- 1 This is a game for two or more people.
- 2 You will need a die.
- 3 Everybody starts on square one.
- 4 Take turns to roll the die.
- **5** Move forward the number of squares as indicated on the die.
- 6 If you land on a pair of fossil feet, follow the feet where they lead.
- 7 If you land on a dinosaur head, slide down the neck to its feet.
- **8** The first person to reach the end is the winner.

Corythosaurus

These duck-billed dinosaurs had toothless beaks and large crests on their heads. They were plant-eating herbivores, with good hearing and a good sense of smell.



Pachycephalosaurus

The thickened skull roofs of these dome-headed dnosaurs allowed them to use their head as a battering ram. they could have charged and head-butted rivals much the way goats and bulls do today.



Stryracosaurus

These herbivores had a long nasal horn and six horns on the back of their frill. They had a thick hide and grew to 5.5 metres in length. Scientists believed they travelled in herds.



Tyrannosaurus rex

Sixty five million years ago, this was one of the fiercest predators on Earth. It was a meat-eating carnivore, attacking and eating other dinosaurs.
