

Wirajuny (*wira-joo-ny*)* - barn owl Munga - night

Wajarri speakers call the barn owl wirajuny.

Wirajuny, like all other owls, is a silent munga predator, capable of flying just centimetres from their prey without being detected. Why can **wirajuny** fly without making a sound?

When wirajuny hunts during the darkness of munga, it can both hear and see its prey. Wirajuny feeds mostly on small mammals, (mainly mice and rats) occasionally taking small birds, reptiles, amphibians and even insects.

Why is **wirajuny**'s name in English a barn owl?

Why is **wirajuny** able to fly and glide without making a sound?

When does **wirajuny** sleep – **thuri** or **munga**?
